# **Dear Parishioners**

I hope that you and your families are well. I send you all my prayers.

In recent days the Bishops Conference of England and Wales has issued a major document concenring the contol of armaments. It is entitled *Called to be Peacemakers - A Catholic approach to arms control and disarmament*. It builds on the long tradition of Catholic Social Teaching which urges us all to work for peace and cooperation in place of conflict. The Bishops begin with a quotation from Pope John Paul II, at his visit to Coventry: *The voices of Christians join with others in urging the leaders of the world to abandon confrontation and to turn their backs on policies which require nations to spend vast sums of money on weapons of mass destruction*. They continue to give the warning of the UN General Secretary, stating that the issue is now more urgent than ever: *Humanity now confronts a new arms race*. *Nuclear weapons are being used as tools of coercion. Weapons systems are being upgraded, and placed at the centre of national security strategies, making these devices of death faster, more accurate and stealthier. All this, at a moment when division and mistrust are pulling countries and regions apart*. They list the reasons why we must all become involved in rejecting this: *Public funds spent on weaponry, including by our own country, could be better used to promote the common good of humanity*.

Weapons are fuelling conflicts across the globe with catastrophic consequences for the most vulnerable people, some of whom seek sanctuary in our communities.

Wars are inflicting damage to ecosystems around the world and increasing carbon emissions, with devastating implications for our common home.

Arms races are fomenting a breakdown of relations among the international community, making cooperation on a wide range of issues more difficult with repercussions for our own futures.

Above all, every human life lost to violence and conflict is a tragedy for our universal family. In Fratelli Tutti Pope Francis encourages us to recognise all people as our sisters and brothers, wherever they are in the world. We cannot, therefore, ever ignore the devastating use of modern weapons beyond our own borders.

#### Our chair of the Finance Committee. Giles Horner, writes:

## 2023 financial report

Overall, the parish managed to retain a surplus of £4,398 in 2023. This was mainly due to an increase in offertory, which included several one-off donations, and was £7,154 higher than 2022. Other income and Traidcraft and events were at similar levels as in 2022. The Finance Committee is very grateful for parishioners' generous offertory support and are pleased to see a continual steady move towards standing orders as the form of giving offertory, as it brings greater clarity on forecasting of our income.

On the cost side, there were inflationary increases in staff and administrative costs as well as other running, maintenance, and utility costs which totalled £2,135 higher than in 2022. These higher costs were offset by a lower fee levied by the Diocese in 2023 and slightly lower liturgy, Traidcraft and event costs.

During 2024, we expect further inflationary increases in costs and higher Diocesan fees. We are also expecting to receive some funds from the sale of St Dunstan's.

## **World Refill Day**

16<sup>th</sup> June is World Refill Day which is a global campaign to prevent plastic pollution and help people live with less waste. A day of action uniting our global community every year on 16<sup>th</sup> June, the campaign is designed to create an alternative vision of the future and accelerate the transition away from single-use plastic towards refill & reuse systems.

#### Why we need a refill revolution

Our throwaway culture is polluting our planet and we need to turn off the tap when it comes to single-use plastic.
