Dear Parishioners

I hope that you and your families are well. I send you all my prayers.

Last Sunday we had our final session of our programme of **Family Catechesis** until we begin again in September. Our thanks go especially to Lizzie Wakeling, the Diocesan Youth Officer, who has been organising this for us; and also to all our parish catechists, who have so generously devoted themselves to the families of the parish, both children and parents. Bishop Richard, in his Pastoral Plan, has emphasised how important continuous catechesis is for all stages in our lives if we are to be able to sustain our faith. We print below an initial invitation to our new programme which will begin after summer, and which now includes two new groups, *Baby Saints*, for three- to five-year-olds, and *Faith Alive*, for nine- to twelve-year-olds; and, of course, we always have the group for parents. Family Formation Information Sheet

What is the Family Formation Process?

At Worth Parish, we have significantly changed the way in which we support families both with their ongoing faith journey and with sacramental preparation.

The Church has always maintained that catechesis, or 'passing on faith', is the primary responsibility of parents. As your parish family, we are here to work with, support and encourage you in this long-term process. We do this by gathering all families together to celebrate, learn and worship: we introduce you to other families, provide you with quality resources that will help you and your children grow in faith and answer any questions you may have.

At the core of the process are the age-appropriate streams for you and your children.

Baby Saints (Children aged 3-5)

Using child friendly resources, your little one will be helped to develop a relationship with God. This will be through a process of wondering and exploration using tactile resources and gentle story telling.

All Saints (Children aged 6-8)

This group has replaced the First Holy Communion programme. Your child will need to be a regular member of this group in order to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation & Holy Communion for the first time within the Parish. When they attend this group, they will learn more about what we believe, and develop their prayer lives – as well as making great friends!

The group leaders review the group twice a year, considering the spiritual maturity of each participant, and they will have a conversation with you if they feel as though your child is ready to receive the Sacraments. However, you are more than welcome to approach them first to have this conversation. You will be provided with materials that explain the discernment process, enabling you to take an active part in this big decision with your child.

It is anticipated that your child will remain in this group after their reception of the Sacraments, to continue growing in faith and friendship.

Faith Alive (Children aged 9-12)

We are told in scripture that 'faith without works is dead' (James 2:17). Faith Alive is a youth group that helps your children explore what it really means to put their faith into action. Whether that be service within the church community, works of charity, or even active evangelisation! All of this within a framework of great fun and friendship.

Inspired (Teenagers aged 13-16)

This youth group has replaced our Confirmation programme, so any young person who desires to receive the Sacrament must be a regular member of this group. The focus of this group is on building community and learning more about God's call on our lives.

The group leaders review the group annually, considering the spiritual maturity of each participant, and they will have a conversation within the group about who might like to be Confirmed. Your family will be provided with materials that explain the discernment process, enabling you to take an active part in this big decision with your child.

It is anticipated that your child will remain in this group after their reception of the Sacrament, to continue growing in faith, be a witness to others, and learn how to use the gifts of the Spirit they have received at Confirmation.

Parents Group

Despite the unimaginative name, this is a wonderful group to belong to as you get to know other parishioners better, whilst learning more about the precious gift of faith. There are four dimensions to formation (the process of becoming more like Christ) human, intellectual, pastoral and spiritual, and our hope is to help you to grow in all of these areas.

We ask that you drop your younger children (3–12-year-olds) at the appropriate location at the start of each session, and they will be brought to you at the end of each session. Dear Friends, we are delighted to invite you to participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) program at Worth Abbey Parish, beginning this September. The RCIA is a journey of faith, providing an opportunity for those who are considering joining the Catholic Church to learn about our beliefs, traditions, and community life.

Whether you are unbaptized, baptized in another Christian tradition, or baptized Catholic but have not received the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist, the RCIA program offers a supportive environment to explore your faith and grow spiritually. Plastic Free July

Plastic Free July is a global initiative challenging us all to reduce our single-use plastic waste for an entire month. Check out the handy guide, packed with great tips and hacks to help you get started, whether you're just beginning your journey to reduce plastic, looking for fresh ideas, or seeking a reset on your sustainable habits, our guide has something for everyone.

Easy changes you can try right now:

- a. Choose loose ditch pre-bagged fruit and veg and opt for loose options wherever possible.
 - **b.** Refillable bottles instead of buying water and other plastic packaged drinks, carry a refillable bottle with you when you're out on the go.
 - **c.** Reusable bags keep a stash of reusable fabric bags in your car or by your front door to avoid needing plastic bags when you shop.
 - **d.** Bring your own container when ordering takeaway of buying from a deli, bring your own container to reduce single-use plastic packaging.
- **e.** Switch to soap bars use soap bars instead of liquid soap in plastic bottles for washing your hands and in the shower. You can also get bars of shampoo in some stores.

Aside from making positive changes in your own home, there are many other ways you can help make a difference this Plastic Free July. Here are some ideas to try:

- **a.** Write to your local MP: ask them to do more to tackle the problem of singleuse plastic in your community and to promote accessible refill and reuse systems.
- **b.** Sign a petition: support campaigns like Choose Loose, Remove plastic packaging which urges supermarkets to remove plastic packaging from fruit and veg, or the Global Plastics Treaty, Global Plastics Treaty Now! which aims to solve the global plastic pollution problem by championing a strong international agreement.

Spread the word: tell your family and friends about Plastic Free July and encourage them to join you in taking part. Together, we can amplify our impact and drive meaningful change.

Community Food Hubs

In October West Sussex County Council launched a six-month pilot project to encourage people to take advantage of surplus food rescue services and food waste prevention education sessions, which in turn, works to reduce the amount of edible food that ends up in people's household rubbish bins. Due to the success of the pilot, working with UKHarvest and other partnerships and charities, in 2023 the programme was extended running until April 2024. The programme prevented over 37 tonnes of food going to waste, provided food to over 11,000 people with over 70% of residents saying that they reduced food from going to waste at home. The programme has been extended for a further 12 months, running once a month across every district borough until April 2025:

<u>Crawley</u> (third Wednesday of the month from 1000-1100) next date **17**th **July** at Broadfield Community Centre, Broadfield Barton, Crawley, RH11 9BA

Horsham (fourth Wednesday of the month from 1000-1100) next date **24**th **July** at Chanctonbury Leisure Centre, Spierbridge Road, Storrington, Pulborough, West Sussex, RH20 4PG

Each district and borough will host a UKHarvest community food hub once a month where, for a small donation, people will be able to pick up a wide selection of surplus foods which would have otherwise ended up as waste from suppliers. Find out more: West Sussex
