# Dear parishioners

This year Prisoners' Sunday – the National Day of Prayer and action for prisoners and their families – falls on 13th October. We would like to share a message from Rt Rev Bishop Richard Moth.

Prisoners' Sunday is an important opportunity for us all to direct our thoughts and prayers to the needs of prisoners and their families, and those who work to support our brothers and sisters affected by the criminal justice system. The number of people in prison in England and Wales is increasing and our prisons are in crisis. In our communities there are more children and families who have a loved one in prison and who may be struggling with stigma, isolation and perhaps hardship, as a result.

Pact is the national Catholic charity working to support prisoners, people with convictions, and children and families. Pact's work is deeply rooted in Catholic Social Teaching. Pact continues to restore hope and dignity to thousands of people affected by imprisonment. Staff and volunteers work in 68 prisons across England and Wales. Their care and practical support help people in prison stay connected with their families. We know that retaining strong family bonds is a significant factor in preventing reoffending.

God of mercy, you offer freedom to all people.

We pray for those in prison and for their children and families.

Break the bonds of fear and isolation that exist.

May your love overcome struggle and heartache and bring new life.

Lord God, we commend to you all who work or volunteer, in courts, prisons and communities.

May they know your presence with them as they work and may their efforts inspire us to share your love ever more widely.

We will remember prisoners and their families at Mass this weekend. Prisons are in crisis and life for prisoners and their families in our communities is challenging. Pact, the national Catholic prison charity supports prisoners, their families and their children, offering them hope and the chance to turn their lives around. There will be a second collection to support Pact's important work.

Pact's Faith in Action team have resources and opportunities for Catholic people to explore how they might respond to Jesus' challenge, 'I was in prison and you visited me'. #### Worth Pro Earth

As the Season of Creation has now come to a close the students at Worth School invite you to continue your reflection on the theme of Creation and Stewardship by participating in their initiative with wider Worth Community as part of their CAFOD LiveSimply for school's award.

The students invite you now to take a practical response. In the narthex you will find a card with three environmental pledges that you can sign, keep and commit to.

The three pledges are as follows:

Pledge 1: I pledge to live sustainably, simply and in solidarity with others by switching off appliances and devices, such as chargers or unnecessary lighting, when I am not using them.

Pledge 2: I pledge to reflect on the words of Pope Francis from Laudato Si regularly. The extract from Laudato Si is printed on the reverse side of the pledge card.

Pledge 3: I pledge to reduce my food and plastic waste, by taking manageable food portions in my meals, as well as using a reusable drink bottle.

In order to evidence this initiative to CAFOD you are kindly asked when committing to the Pledge(s), to sign your first name only on the large sheet provided in the narthex during the month of October. These pledges will also be signed by the Worth students and staff this month. This is a wonderful practical step towards fulfilling our role as a steward of creation.

This initiative is part of Worth Pro Earth's work with the school's Worth Environment Society.

#### Worth Pro-Earth was in full swing as the season of Creation wrapped up last weekend.

On Wednesday we were privileged to read the lessons at the pupil-led Wednesday Worship. A huge amount of thoughtful preparation went into this service celebrating our role as stewards of the Earth. It was very moving and beautifully managed by the members of the Worth Environment Society.

Friday evening brought Nicola Peel <a href="https://www.nicolapeel.com/">https://www.nicolapeel.com/</a> to the Performing Arts Centre of the School to give an extremely interesting presentation on her work in the Amazon and the challenges of the indigenous people living there, particularly dealing with the thousands of oil spills which bring real devastation. Another part of the presentation focused on biomimicry - lessons from Nature on how to deal with environmental challenges. Nicola describes herself as a solutionologist so the tone of the evening was of creativity and hope.

Finally - on Sunday after Mass we had a screening of a beautiful CAFOD supported film - Global Healing. Again the message was that we have to act to protect our world, but that doing so brings huge personal benefit as well as being for the greater good. The film made the whole ecological conversion message in a very positive way. Thank you to those who attended for your attention and useful comments.


As we work towards a greener future, here are 5 key goals to push for with your MP:
