# **Dear Parishioners**

I hope that you and your families are well. I send you all my prayers.

This weekend we begin the **Octave of Prayer for Christian Unity**. The cause of Christian Unity may seem today as remote as ever, but no less urgent for that reason. It is clear that Jesus intended us to form one Church, the community of faith which is his Body, and we should always pray and work together for that. In his account of the Last Supper St John gives us a prayer which Jesus offers to his Father on our behalf, sometimes known as his High-Priestly prayer, in which he dedicates his disciples, and all who will become disciples through their work, to his Father: *Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. As you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. I ask not only on behalf of these, but also on behalf of those who will believe in me through their word, that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me (John 17:17-21). Our unity as Christians is vital to the evangelisation of our world, and lack of unity is an obstacle to it.* 

This week of prayer is given us to encourage our personal prayer and action in forming relationships with Christians of other Churches. The material below comes from the monastic community of Bose in northern Italy. They begin their reflections on Christian Unity from the anniversary this year of the Council of Nicaea, which, in 325, defined belief in Jesus' divinity a central part of the Christian faith. They write: There is an opportunity to celebrate and draw strength and encouragement from the gift of our shared faith. In these troubled and turbulent times, we can take heart from the endurance of that faith. The Church that gathered in Nicaea was one that had been shaken and wounded by violence and persecution and was therefore close to the suffering of humanity. It was presented with an opportunity for dialogue with the political power which posed difficult choices about how best to share the Good News of the Gospel as faithful disciples of Christ, whose Kingdom is not of this world. In today's polarised world, when trust in the willingness of political powers and authorities, including the Church, to protect the most vulnerable has been undermined, how might a renewal of our commitment to Christian unity contribute to positive change?


#### Introducing Jubilee online session – 18th January 2025: 10:30am-12 noon.

#### **Worth Pro Earth**

Shred your Christmas tree, not your gadgets' urges e-waste charity - Positive News

So the decorations are down, the new calendar is up, and the tree's off to be recycled. But what's planned for the old technology we've replaced this Christmas?

The Restart Project is a charity working to tackle e-waste, it is encouraging people to reconsider where they take their unwanted gadgets, drawing attention to alternatives that are more environmentally friendly than recycling centres. While our Christmas trees are shredded into organic matter that is great for the soil, when electronics enter the recycling stream, it's a very different story.

"The devices will usually be put into huge shredders, which uses lots of energy and generally fail to recover many of the precious metals and critical raw materials in our devices - materials we need to power the green energy transition", explained Fiona Dear, director of the Restart Project.

The charity recently published a report The Restart Project revealing that 81% of waste facilities in the UK send all electrical and electronic waste into shredders. Reuse and repair are far more cost-effective, energyefficient and environmentally conscious options.

The Restart Project, which aims to improve our relationship with electronics and 'to keep electrical products in use for longer and slow the growing mountain of e-waste', supports regular London-based 'restart parties' and networks of repair cafes globally.

There are also numerous projects and businesses across the UK that offer ways to donate old electronics. "Many waste companies and local authorities understand these issues really well." They want to see more reuse happening and they're exploring ways to avoid sending your gadget to the shredder." See the link to the website for more information: e-waste Charity
